The California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation (CDCR), Office of Victim and Survivor Rights and Services (OVSRS) would like to take this opportunity to remind victims and survivors of crime the importance of registering with our office to receive valuable services provided by CDCR. Registering with CDCR will allow you access to a menu of resources including advanced notification of release, escape or death of an offender, assist you with collection of court ordered victim restitution, assistance with information regarding the parole hearing process and the ability to request certain special conditions of parole. With California's evolution of sentencing laws, registration for services is extremely important so victims are ensured to receive up-to-date information.
