
#### FEBRUARY IS AMERICAN HEART MONTH

### WHAT IS THE NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH PROGRAM?



The Neighborhood Watch program started in 1972 as a national movement encouraging citizens to partner with police to reduce crime in their area. The motto of Neighborhood Watch is, "We Look Out For Each Other." The goal is to reduce crime by suggesting to the public that they take an active part in the safety of their neighborhood. In this program, citizens establish and maintain a safe neighborhood through vigilance and cooperation with the police department.

The first step in starting your own Neighborhood Watch is to talk to your neighbors. Be sure to mention that Neighborhood Watch does not require frequent meetings nor does it ask anyone to take any personal risks to prevent crime. The responsibility for apprehending criminals belongs with the Burbank Police Department.

Once you have established interest in your neighborhood, contact the Burbank Police Department's Community Resource Officer to set up a date for an officer to attend a meeting. At the meeting, the officer will discuss the dynamics of Neighborhood Watch groups, address your neighborhood's concerns, and provide insight to recent crime trends and ways to protect yourself, your vehicle, and your home.
