Burbank Police Set for 2018 Special Olympics Torch Run

On June 6, several members of the Burbank Police Department will participate in the 2018 Special Olympics Torch Run. Around 12:30 P.M., members of the Burbank Police Department will receive the torch in a hand-off from the Los Angeles Police Department at Riverside Drive and Clybourn Avenue. The torch will then be carried eastbound along Riverside Drive to Alameda Avenue, before making its way up Olive Avenue, past Burbank City Hall to the Burbank Police Station. After a photo opportunity, the torch will be carried south along Glenoaks Boulevard to Alameda Avenue, where it will be handed-off to members of the Glendale Police Department. The public is encouraged to come out and cheer on our runners.

Drug Take Back Nets Nearly 600 Pounds

On April 28, the Burbank Police Department hosted the Drug Take Back Event in collaboration with the Drug Enforcement Administration and National Drug Take Back Day. The purpose of this event was to provide the public with a safe method of disposal for unused, unwanted, or expired medications, and to reduce the misuse of these drugs. Between 10 A.M. to 2 P.M., citizens were able to relinquish their medications on a "no questions asked" basis with complete anonymity. The Burbank Police Department collected 560 pounds of medication during the event, which was nearly 20 percent more than what was collected last April.

- Bank accounts and personal information.
- Monitor and check your accounts regularly.
- Register for fraud alerts to be notified of suspicious activity.

- Browser history after visiting account-related websites.
- Stored passwords on shared devices.
- Personal information on public websites and/or social media pages.
 - Suspicious phone calls or calls that ask for payments of any kind over the phone.
 - Phone calls from someone claiming to be the I.R.S. of F.T.B. seeking tax payments.
 - Calls from people claiming to have loved ones held captive.
 - Calls from "bill collectors" claiming to be from Burbank Water & Power.
