New Resource Page Aimed to Help Users Beat Addiction

A new page has been added to the Burbank Police Department website, one aimed at helping drug and alcohol abusers beat addiction. One of the main topics addressed is the abuse of Opioids. According to statistics, the Opioid Epidemic kills 174 people each day in our country, and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has reported substantial overdose increases in every demographic group.

The Burbank Police Department is taking a proactive approach to combating the current Opioid Epidemic facing this country. By creating a community resource page on the website, Burbank Police hope to help addicts and their families navigate the painful road to recovery. Also included is information for parents with children who may be struggling, and how to identify the signs of drug use and/or bullying. The information contained on this page provides locally-available resources and vital information on how to be prepared in the event of an emergency overdose with a loved one.

By providing this information, Burbank Police hope to educate the community on drug and alcohol addiction, provide those suffering from addiction the methods and tools needed to seek help, and offer encouragement and support to the families. On Saturday, August 18, the Burbank Animal Shelter held a "Clear the Shelter" event, during which adoption fees for all animals were reduced to \$20.

More than 50 Volunteers of the Burbank Animal Shelter (VBAS) made this day possible by assisting staff with over 400 customers who came through the door. The day resulted in 28 cats, five dogs, one guinea pig and one bunny finding their forever homes.

Among recent successes at the shelter include the adoption of cats Stevie and Daisy. Stevie and Daisy are brother and sister, and Daisy is completely blind. Combined with her close bond with Stevie, this made Daisy's adoption difficult. But, after several months, we are happy to announce that Daisy and Stevie have found their new home!
