COMMUNITY BULLETIN BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY

DATE: August 14, 2014

Traffic safety at our schools is a priority for the Burbank Police Department. Traffic officers are assigned to patrol schools as a visible deterrent to prevent incidents from occurring and to enforce traffic laws. By following a few simple rules, parents can assist us in creating a safe environment around our schools for students, faculty, and parents.

<u>Do's:</u>

- 1. Slow down around the schools; plan ahead and arrive early
- 2. Use the safe delivery/valet drop-off area
- **3.** Position your children on the right side of the vehicle, so they exit onto the sidewalk, away from any moving vehicles
- 4. Stay alert; do not operate cell phones or allow other things to distract you
- 5. Park your car in the appropriate areas; obey posted parking restrictions
- 6. Obey all traffic laws

Don'ts:

- 1. Stop and park your vehicle in the delivery/valet drop-off area
- 2. Park and exit your vehicle in the passenger loading/unloading areas
- 3. Stop your vehicle in the middle of the street to let your child in or out of the vehicle
- 4. Walk between vehicles in the drop-off and pick-up area
- 5. Park across the street and direct your child to cross the street outside of the designated crossing area
- 6. Pass vehicles on the wrong side of the street
- 7. Leave your vehicle unattended

Safety Tips:

- 1. Park your vehicle away from the school and escort your child to the school gate
- 2. Cross at corners and use the crossing guards to assist
- **3.** Plan ahead; arrive early
