SHOOTING INVESTIGATION

"CAR-TO-CAR" SHOOTING ON THE BURBANK OVERPASS

DATE: February 8, 2016

This evening, at about 7:45 pm, Burbank Police Officers responded to the 1600 block of Grismer Avenue, regarding a male who was suffering from a gunshot wound. Responding officers located a 30 year-old male, who is a Burbank resident, with at least one gunshot wound to the upper body. He was treated and transported to a local hospital where he is being treated for, what appear to be, non-life threatening injuries.

Officers and detectives spoke with several witnesses, which led them to the Burbank Boulevard Overpass. This is where we believe a "car-to-car" shooting took place and resulted in the victim's injuries.

The suspected shooter is described only as a male, with his vehicle described as being black in color and last seen westbound on the overpass.

The Burbank Boulevard Overpass, which is a bridge over the Interstate 5 Freeway, was closed during the on-scene investigation, but has since reopened to both vehicle and passenger traffic. The freeway off-ramps have also reopened.

There is a second related scene in the Wells Fargo Bank parking lot, 900 N. San Fernando Boulevard, which is being processed. Investigators believe the victim made his way to that parking lot after the shooting, before ultimately landing on Grismer Avenue.

Investigators will be working into the morning processing evidence, interviewing witnesses and following any leads that develop.
