

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

The Neighborhood Watch program started in 1972 as a national movement encouraging citizens to partner with police in an effort to reduce crime.

Burbank Police Neighborhood Watch Program

The motto of Neighborhood Watch is, "We Look Out For Each Other." The goal is to reduce and deter crime by taking an active part in the safety of your neighborhood. In this program, citizens establish and maintain a safe neighborhood through vigilance and cooperation with the police department.

The first step in starting your own Neighborhood Watch is to speak with your neighbors. Once you have established interest in your neighborhood, contact a Burbank Police Department Community Resource Officer to set a date for an officer to attend a meeting. At the meeting, the officer will discuss the dynamics of Neighborhood Watch groups, address your neighborhood's concerns, and provide insight to recent crime trends and ways to protect yourself, your vehicle, and your home.
