March is a time to celebrate the great profession of social work! A Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) is a mental health professional who provides therapy, evaluation intervention, and case management services to those who are suffering from mental, social, familial, and/or medical issues.

LCSWs can likely spend 6 years studying to earn both a bachelor's and master's degree. Post-graduation, an additional 2-4 years is needed to earn a required amount of experience and supervised hours.
