



Impairment, speeding, street racing, and other dangerous driving behaviors jeopardize the safety of other people on the road. Burbank PD continues to enforce traffic laws with the goal of reducing collisions, educating the citizens in our community, and keeping our community safe. This is achieved through the establishment of preventative patrols to manage specific categories of unlawful driving behavior.
