2019 Matthew Pavelka Scholarships Awarded to High School Seniors

Prior to the Burbank City Council Meeting on April 30, 2019, six local high school seniors were each awarded with a \$1,500 scholarship in memory of fallen Burbank Police Officer, Matthew Pavelka. The students will receive the scholarships upon completing a fall semester at a public or private junior college, or accredited university that offers academic or vocational courses leading to a secondary degree.



The Matthew Pavelka Scholarship Awards Program was established by the Burbank Police Foundation in honor of Burbank Police Officer Matthew Pavelka, who was killed in the line of duty on November 15, 2003. Scholarships are awarded to high school seniors who have demonstrated outstanding efforts in pursuit of an educational or vocational goal. The purpose of the program is to motivate students to dedicate themselves more thoroughly and responsibly to their education and training, and to encourage them to strive for excellence and distinction in whatever field they choose. Run to Remember Honors Fallen First Responders




