The Quantity Charge is subject to a purchased Water Cost Adjustment Charge (WCAC) as specified in this section in order to compensate the City for its varying costs of purchasing or producing water. All such costs shall be estimated monthly by the General Manager for the next 12month period. The WCAC reserve balance will be adjusted by any under or over-collections of water costs exceeding the WCAC reserve balance limits experienced by the City. The City Council will be advised of any change in the WCAC rate.
(2) "Estimated Units of Water Sales" shall mean: the hundreds of cubic feet of potable water sales for the next 12 -month period as estimated by the General Manager.
