INTRODUCTION

Internal affairs investigations consist of investigations of any allegation of misconduct or improper job performance against any Department employee that, if true, would constitute a violation of policies, rules, or regulations. The investigations are categorized as follows:

Citizen Complaint – An allegation of employee misconduct from any source outside the Department.

<u>Personnel Investigation</u> – An allegation of employee misconduct from any source within the Department.

<u>Unfounded</u> – When the investigation discloses that the alleged act did not occur or did not involve Department personnel (includes frivolous complaints).

Exonerated – When the investigation discloses that the alleged act occurred but that the act was justified, lawful, or proper.

 $\underline{\textbf{Not Sustained}} - \textbf{When the investigation discloses that there is insufficient evidence to sustain the complaint or fully exonerate the employee .}$

<u>Sustained</u> – When the investigation discloses sufficient evidence to establish that the act occurred and that it constituted misconduct.
